



Kendal Snowsports Club - Freestyle Members Declaration

I understand that before using any of the clubs freestyle features or taking part in a freestyle session I have watched the video based induction.
I understand importance of using freestyle appropriate kit including compulsory use of helmets, and advice on back/body protection.
I understand the value of warming up and getting a feel for how the slope is running/my kit is performing before increasing the difficulty of any freestyle moves.
I understand that very warm and icy conditions can have an adverse effect on how the slope surface runs and that wind can affect the use of jump features.
I understand slope etiquette and safety including: ○ Ensuring the previous participant has cleared the jump blind spot and completed their run before setting off ○ Signal and/or give a verbal warning before dropping in ○ No snaking (cutting in on the queue) ○ No getting off the lift below the jumps ○ How to use the emergency stop on a tow in case of emergency ○ If wanting to avoid the jumps, ensuring that the jump queue knows you intend to drop in. ○ Safety Signals for stopping a run and showing its clear to carry on
I know where to find the Code of Conduct for members located on the club website and the lodge notice board and will adhere to them when using the slope.
I know about different freestyle features and their associated risks
I will not ride beyond my ability and if deemed to be doing so I may be asked to stop using a feature by a slope official.
I understand that inverted moves can only be undertaken by advanced membership holders who have had a separate accreditation process.
I understand that freestyle activities are inherently dangerous and there is a risk of injury even by those well practiced.
I understand that all juniors under 12 years of age must be supervised by an adult.
We take safeguarding very seriously at KSC.
